Henry Hudson, mariner and adventurer, lived in London England and sailed for Holland. During Hudson's life he went on 4 voyages. On his first voyage in 1607, he discovered the Whales of Spitzbergen Island which offered a significant commercial opportunity to English Sailors. Henry Hudson's second voyage in 1608, he discovered nothing. Hudson's third voyage was in 1609 when he explored the

Northeastern coast of America. Finally on Henry Hudson's voyage in 1610, he sent off to search for the Northwest passage. On Hudson's fourth voyage, they believed that he landed somewhere in the Arctic Ocean. After several months, Hudson's men demanded to return to England but Hudson refused so they threw him, his son, and 7 loyal crew members in to an open row boat and set them adrift and they were never seen again. During Hudson's life he also sailed three different ships. The names of his ships were :

- (1) Half Moon
- (2) Discovery
- (3) Hopewell

There were also several places that were named after Henry Hudson such as Hudson Strait the "Furious overfall" which is located in London. Henry Hudson's regional school. Hudson Bay and Hudson Strait where both discovered in 1910 by Henry Hudson, and Henry Hudson trail.

Henry Hudson, a famous-mariner and adventurer, died in 1611. Henry Hudson was 53 when he died. <
